P-PATCH CODE OF CONDUCT

While enjoying your community garden, the following are prohibited:

- **Destruction of property**
- Unleashed and or aggressive **dogs**
- **Theft** of plants or property
- **Sexual misconduct**
- Possession, sale, or use of **illegal drugs**
- **Disposing of unwanted items anywhere** but in a designated trash or recycling receptacle
- **Possession of firearms**
- Any **conduct that unreasonably interferes** with other people's use of the P-Patch.
- **Harassment** of a member of the public, gardener, or staff.
- Drinking of **alcoholic beverages** without permission from Salmon Center staff.
- **Smoking**
- **Improper use of water fixtures** (e.g., no bathing, shampooing, or washing clothes)
- Engaging in **disruptive/ unsafe behavior** that disturbs others in the garden
- **Spitting, urinating, or defecating** (except in designated restroom fixtures)

Enforcement: Failure to comply with the rules may result in:

- Disqualification from further participation in the P-Patch program;
- Withdrawal of permission to remain on the property for a specified period of time;
- Any person who enters or remains on P-patch property after having been notified that their permission to be on the property has been withdrawn is subject to citation or arrest for criminal trespass.
